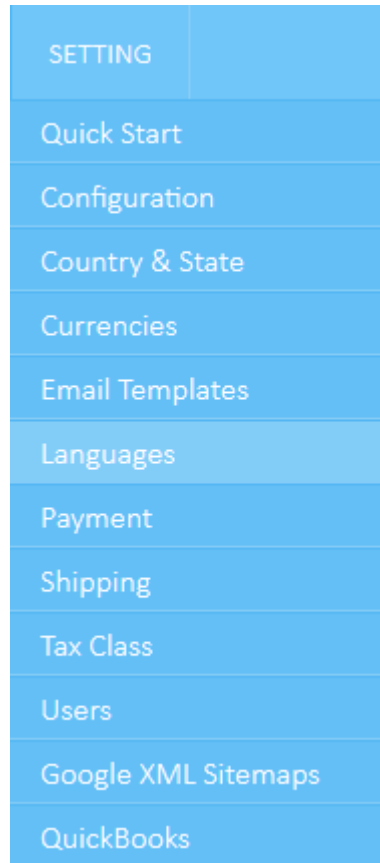
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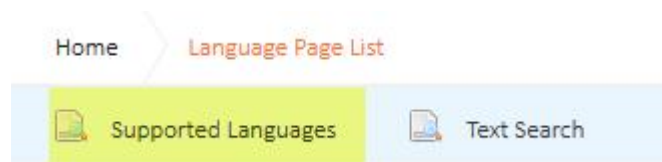
1. Adding new language

To add new language in VevoCart, please login to VevoCart admin panel.

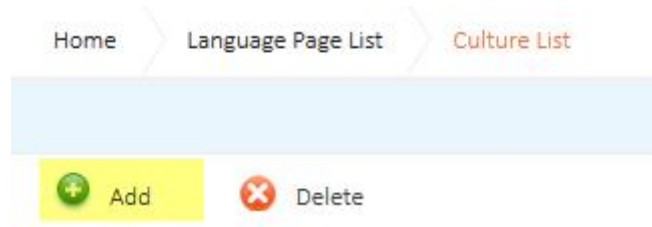
- 1) Go to tab "Setting" choose "Language" menu.



- 2) Choose "Support Languages" button



3) Click “Add” button



4) Enter Information and click “Add Culture” button

2. Remove language

In “Culture List” page, check the checkbox in front of language and click “Delete” button.

3. Enable / Disable language

In “Culture List” page, click “Edit” button and uncheck “Enable” setting then click “Update Culture” button



Please note that the language dropdown in storefront will not display the languages that are disabled.



4. Adding Language Text

VevoCart used language text in storefront for display multiple languages. You can define new language text parameter by insert [\$mytext] in the code.

If the language parameter of selected culture in language dropdown doesn't exist in language text list, storefront will use text from default language for display in storefront.

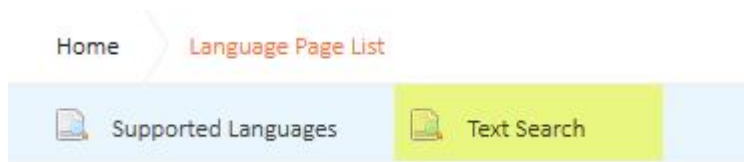

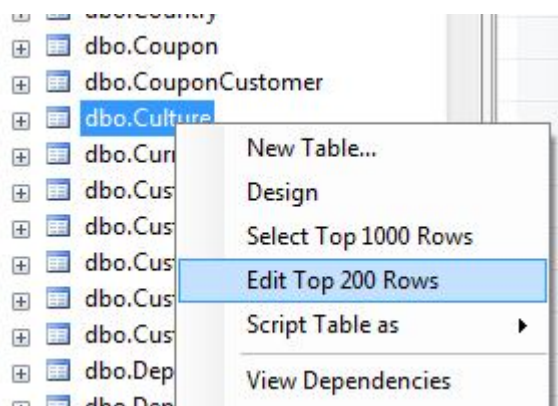


5. Put Translation from Excel to Database

From the Excel file, enter your translation into the last column, which is called “TextData (New Language)”.

- Enter the translation for every row. If you do not want to translate some keywords, delete those rows. Otherwise, it will show up as blank in your store front.
- By default, the words that you do not translate will use English as a fallback language. Please refer to “Base language for undefined keyword” option in the Quick Start guide for more information.

- 1) Open the database table “Culture”. (Right click at the database table and select “Edit Top 200 Rows”)



- 2) Fill all culture details:

- CultureID: Enter the number greater than the existing cultureID number.
- Name: Added the culture name according to Microsoft .NET culture format.

- DisplayName: Enter the name of your language.
- Enabled: Enter True or False

- 3) Back up your Excel file.
- 4) In the Excel file, delete “TextData (English)” and “Path” columns (column B & D in the original file).
- 5) Add a column called “CultureID” as the second column from the left as shown below.

6) Enter the Culture ID from step 2) into every row in the Excel file.

7) Select the first four columns (A, B, C, D) and drag to select every row with data (which are hundreds of rows).

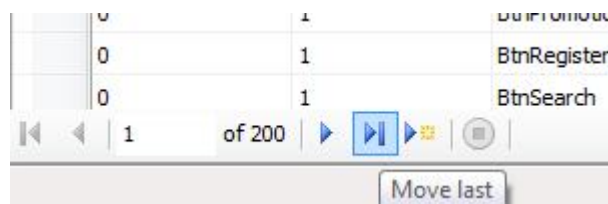

9) Back up your database.

10) For SQL Server, you will need to use a GUI tool called SQL Server Management Studio.

11) Open the database table "LanguageText" and go to the last
